Neil Davidson trained as a youth worker, and has been involved in developing work with boys and young men since 1982, with a focus on sex and relationships education. During the 1980's he worked for New Grapevine (a pioneering youth project in London), then for Save The Children. He was a co-founder of Working With Men, and then a full-time consultant for Working with Men from 1991 to 2006. This involved the development of work with men and boys through training, consultancy and the production of resources. He then became Bristol Local Authorities Sex Education consultant, working with primary and secondary schools throughout the city, and continued to develop teaching resources, focusing on SRE.

Throughout, Neil's focus has been on understanding masculinity and gender, and making this accessible, and practical to mainstream work with young people.
